## **BRICKIE KIDZ and KINDERGARTEN**

School City of Hobart parents may enroll their **preschool** child if he/she is **four** years old on or before August 1st.

School City of Hobart parents may enroll their **kindergarten** child if he/she is **five** years old on or before August 1st.

## Enrollment Requirements Parent/Guardian will need to provide the following documents:

- an Indiana Driver's License or Indiana State I.D. listing current Hobart address
- 2 additional proofs of residency (i.e. utility bills/mortgage papers)
- child's original birth certificate
- immunization records
- custody papers if necessary

## **Kindergarten Transportation**

The transportation department will inform you of the pick-up & drop-off times for your child. It is highly recommended to have your child at the bus stop five minutes before the bus is due to arrive.

After school, please be outside and visible to the bus driver five minutes before the bus is due to arrive. Bus assignments will be communicated to families before the start of school.


## Kindergarten

### Printing

Kindergarten students will develop writing and printing skills.

Through hands-on exercises and inquiry methods, students will learn number concepts including counting, graphing, numeral values and equations. Students will learn shapes, patterns and problem-solving skills.

Students use concrete, hands-on experiences and experiments, to understand science in the physical and natural world around them and question through an inquiry model.
